Guidance Notes

Educating the public in history and archaeology is an important goal of GGAT, and in accordance with *Cwricwlwm Cymreig* we attempt to encourage student interest in Welsh history and culture within a regional, national and global context. Possible visits and resources have been mapped out against the current curriculum for Key Stages 2, 3 and 4, in compliance with the learning requirements of the National Curriculum for Wales and the Welsh Joint Education Committee (WJEC). The table below displays topics which are intended to be studied in relation to Wales and the educational body which has been consulted.
